2. I do not want existing neighborhoods along the Rex Whitton Expressway from Clark St . to Jefferson St . to be demolished and the area sacrificed to expand the Rex Whitton Expressway . Adding one or more lanes each way is acceptable only if it doesn't destroy existing neighborhoods . Jefferson City is already struggling with the problem of home owners not wanting to live in Jefferson City, and choosing to live in outlying surburban areas outside the city limits . One factor that drives home owners out of the city is that they find the city unappealing . Destroying existing neighborhoods and replacing them with concrete and highways only makes the city more unappealing and uninviting .

Thank you very much for conducting the public meeting on June 9. The format of the meeting was very good . I liked the way you kept the presentation very short, just stating important things for the public to know, and then you allowed people to speak one on one with staff that were there instead of requiring people to get up and make a statement .







The Missouri Catholic Conference has had its office at 600 Clark Ave. since the 1970s. It greatly assists our operation to be close to the on/off ramp of Highway 50/63. We lobby at the Capitol six months of the year so we do a lot of coming and going by car to the Capitol. Unlike other businesses that may be leaving the East side, we intend to remain here. We don't have to worry about parking and the downtown traffic. We have quite a few meetings involving out of town participants at our office. It greatly assists our operation to have the on/off ramp coming right to our building. It would be difficult for the large trucks that bring deliveries to our office, paper supplies for printing, delivery trucks for mail pick-ups and food trucks to maneuver on and off the highway without the existing on/off ramps. It is very easy for them to get off and on to Clark Ave. from the highway, make the deliveries to our office and go right back on to the ramp to the highway without having to go on to residential streets. If either of the on/off ramps were closed to Clark Avenue it would cause us a lot of inconvenience. We feel our property value would decrease if either ramp was closed hindering access to and from the highway. We understand the need to increase the capacity of the Expressway to make it safer and to incorporate easy accessible plans to the old Jefferson City Correctional Center site, however we request that both the entrance and exit ramps at Clark Avenue remain open.


