Frequently Asked Questions

Q. What work is being proposed as part of this project?

A. The project includes adding shoulders to accommodate bicycle lanes along Route K in Boone County. The new four-foot shoulders will be constructed along both sides of the highway from Route 163 to the Katy Trail in McBaine. The work will improve safety for those traveling Route K. The work also complements the non-motorized transportation system improvements currently underway in the Columbia region.

Q. When will work take place and how will traffic be handled during the work?

A. Work will take place during the 2012 construction season. It will be necessary to close lanes and flag traffic during the work. Motorists should follow work zone signing and allow additional time to travel through the area.

Q. Will additional right of way be needed to construct this project?

A. Some right of way or easements are needed for this project. For those property owners affected, we encourage you to reference a MoDOT brochure titled "Pathways for Progress." This brochure outlines the process and should answer most of your questions. If you have questions after viewing the brochure, our Right of Way staff will be pleased to assist you. Q. How will my driveway or other items located on right of way be impacted by this project?

A. Driveway entrances within the project area may need to be modified to accommodate the new shoulders. Landscaping and/or fencing located on right of way may be affected and mailboxes along the routes will be relocated and reinstalled to meet U.S. Postal Service guidelines.

Q. What is the project cost?

A. The project will cost about \$2 million to construct.
