The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and the National Parks Service (NPS), is proposing improvements to Interstate 70 for road and ramp improvements in St. Louis City, Missouri. This letter is to inform your agency of the project and determine if you have any comments, concerns, or information regarding the proposed project location and design.

The Interstate 70 Jefferson National Expansion Memorial (JNEM) improvements include the following design changes to the way that Interstate 70 currently functions.

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- 2) The reversal of the on and off ramps at Washington Avenue.
- 3) The extension of North Third Street to connect with I-70 westbound at the Martin Luther King Bridge.
- 4) Possible expansion of I-70 westbound on-ramp at Biddle Street.

Enclosed is a map showing the location of the proposed roadway improvements. MoDOT is currently developing an Environmental Assessment to document the development of the project as well as the impacts to the social and natural environment. Should the proposed alternative require any additional environmental study due to significant impacts, appropriate agencies will be notified. Cooperating and Participating Agency Request/Invitation to Agency Scoping Meeting

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), in cooperation with the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), is initiating an Environmental Assessment (EA) for modification of the ramps on Interstate 70 from Washington Street to Interstate 64 in St. Louis City. The goal of the project, as currently defined, is to revitalize the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial by providing new park access as well as expanding the park to the north.

Improvements to Interstate 70 associated with this project are:

- 1) A new deck over I-70 with the closure of portions of Memorial Drive,
- 2) Flipping the I-70 ramps at Washington Avenue,
- 3) Closure of the Washington Avenue Spur and the removal of the Arch garage,
- 4) Extension of North 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to connect with I-70 Westbound at the Martin Luther King Bridge,
- 5) And the possible expansion of I-70 Westbound On-ramp at Biddle Street.

With this letter, FHWA and MoDOT request your agency to be a cooperating agency, in accordance with 40 CFR 1501.6 of the Council on Environmental Quality's Regulations for Implementing the Procedural Provision of the National Environmental Policy Act, because the project may involve impacts to Jefferson National Expansion Memorial. This designation does not imply that your agency is in support of the proposal. The enclosed scoping packet provides additional information on the project.

Your agency's involvement as a cooperating agency should include those areas under its jurisdiction and expertise, with no direct writing or analysis expected for preparation of the EA. We will take the following actions to maximize interagency cooperation:

- 1) Invite you to coordination meetings;
- 2) Consult with you on any relevant technical studies the project requires;
- 3) Provide you with project information, including study results;
- 4) Encourage you to use the above documents to express your agency's views on subjects within its jurisdiction or expertise; and
- 5) Include information in the project environmental documents that your agency needs to discharge its National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) responsibilities and satisfy the requirements of the Section 4(f) or the Department of Transportation Act of 1966.

The NPS has the right to expect that the EA will enable you to discharge your jurisdictional responsibilities. If at any point in the process your agency's needs are not being met, we need to be informed so steps can be taken to resolve the issue. We expect that at the end of the process the EA will satisfy your NEPA requirements including those related to project alternatives, environmental consequences, and mitigation. Further, we intend to utilize the EA and any subsequent decision-making document as the basis for any permit applications.

Pursuant to Section 6002 of SAFETEA-LU, we ask participating agencies to identify, as early as practicable, any issues of concern regarding the project's potential environmental or socioeconomic impacts that could substantially delay or prevent an agency from granting a permit or other approval that is needed for the project. We suggest that your agency's role in the development of the I-70 EA should include the following as they relate to your area of expertise:

- 1) Provide meaningful and early input on defining the purpose and need, determining the range of alternatives to be considered, and the methodologies and level of detail required in the alternatives analysis.
- 2) Participate in coordination meetings and joint field reviews as appropriate.

- 3) Provide timely review and comment on the pre-final environmental document to reflect the views and concerns of your agency on the adequacy of the document, alternatives considered, and the anticipated impacts and mitigation.

We look forward to your response to this request and your role as a cooperating agency on this project. Please respond in writing to Mr. Kevin Ward, Division Administrator, Federal Highway Administration, 3220 West Edgewood, Suite H, Jefferson City, MO 65109 with an acceptance or denial of the invitation to be a cooperating agency by July 29, 2011. If your agency declines, please state your reason for declining the invitation.




